Second paragraph: Focus on childcare. What have been your experiences with children, why your background and upbringing makes you the best nurturer for children? Give details (did you teach a child to potty train, ride a bike, tie their shoes, abc's, are you knowledgeable in infant care? Have you taken care of multiples?

A child with a disability?

Third paragraph: Why should they hire YOU! This is your personal marketing message to the client. Use it! Tell the client why you are special, qualified and ready to take on this career. Make it creative and something for them to remember and say WOW!

Do not go into detail about anything too personal. Remember that your employers are interested to know a little bit about who you are but most importantly what you can do for both them and their children.

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
